



ESVAGT's new Head of HSEQ Charlotte Feldvoss sees a strong safety culture as essential for ESVAGT's results.

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“We deliver safety!”

“When a company grows so much, it experiences a transformation and in this process it risks losing what it was that made the company unique. This has not happened here. Safety is the core element of ESVAGT; working safely is in the blood of its people - we deliver safety,” she says.

We need to continue to refine this and build upon it:

“We need to maintain our ambition of continuously improving. Our company is built on the drive to become constantly better and that ambition is important - it is what moves us forward,” she emphasises.
